









## KAIKÕURA CRUISE SEASON 2024-25

Kaikōura is known as a tender port due to the inability to dock alongside the jetty. Ships that visit our waters drop anchor a few hundred meters off the South Bay marina due to not being a deep water port and then tender passengers to the jetty.

The tender boats are specialised lifeboats that are visible on the ships deck when sailing. With nicer seating and larger windows than the more specialisesd lifeboats used for emergency situations. Very small ships will even use Zodiac style boats, similar to the inflatable surf lifesaving boats people may be familiar with. These tenders or Zodiacs can hold anywhere from a 12 to 50 passengers depending on their size. At peak times multiple tenders will be used to transfer cruise ship passengers to an from the ship as required.

The ships safety/security crew will bring the first tender to the pier to set up their embarkation area and security check point that the ship's crew will manage for the duration of the visit. Then the guests will start boarding the tenders to come ashore, this is typically within 30 minutes of the ship safely anchoring and giving the all clear to begin the tender operation. Guests with early tours or arrangements are given priority, followed by the rest of the guests and the ships crew. The ship's crew are typically given leave to visit ashore +/- one hour of arrival and departure. Most small to medium sized ships can embark all the ships guests in 60-90 minutes.

From the pier guests are free to explore the area as they wish for the duration of the stay. The last tender for guests is typically 30 minutes prior to official departure time. The ships will raise anchor and leave shortly after 'all aboard' is announced. One thing worth keeping in mind is that the ship will not wait for passengers if late to the ship. Please have guests back in a timely manner if with you in the afternoon.

The captain is constantly monitoring the weather, if he or she feels it is unsafe to tender passengers ashore they will by pass Kaikōura and head to their next port of call. The captain's call is not usually known until early morning of the day they are scheduled to visit.
